### Getting a Spot

#### Features:

Besides having enough space for them to sit and do whatever they're going to do, some other features that would be *nice (but not necessary)* would be:

- Wall space to hang papers or tack up index cards
- A hook for a light jacket or blanket
- A small shelf
- A plug if they're going to use technology for reading, reference, or music
- Decorations they like (for example, paint, vinyl wall decor, etc.)

#### Places:

You don't need an entire room for this, just a spot you can keep "roped off."

- Their room
- The kitchen
- A home office
- Your room
- The backyard
- The guest room
- A sparse closet (They LOVE this! Kids like places that feel secret, where only they go.)
- A tent, bought or homemade (Same as the closet, they love this kind of thing.)
- Look around for other little nooks--utility rooms, breakfast nook, entryway, etc.

### Getting the Stuff

It's not important to spend a lot of money or a lot of time on this. These are just ideas. What matters is how your child works best, how they focus, what motivates them. What do *you* like for your time with God?

#### Supplies:
